Finding Local Volunteering

Find local charities by using SUBU Volunteering Hub and searching under '**Browse Charities**'.

Once you find a charity that inspires you, google them and contact them via email or phone them to put forward your proposal for volunteering with them.

You can also browse current '**local opportunities**' and apply for roles by hitting the '**Apply Now**' button..

Online/Remote Volunteering


Too busy to do volunteering in the community? Why not have a go at online/remote volunteering?

There are research charities and organisations on the hub who require help with observation and research which can also count towards volunteering.

This means you can even volunteer from your own bed!!



FAQ's



Q – Do all members of a Club have to do the volunteering?

A – No, as long as a group of you do volunteering.

Q – Do we have to volunteer all year?

A – No, we encourage you to seek out 'one off' opportunities



Q – Should volunteering cost me or my club money?

A – No, it should only cost time and not money. Most charities will offer to cover travel/transport costs to volunteering opportunities however you can apply for/use grant funding to supplement costs.
