What we expect from you



What is a Committee role?

First and foremost, you are a volunteer. You have volunteered your time to give back to your club communities and build on the experiences your club provides to give your members a quality experience.

That said, there are some expectations we need to set before term begins.



So, what do we expect?

Our expectations fall into 4 categories:

- 1. Communication
- 2. Processes
- 3. Training
- 4. Ambition and Respect





1. Communication

What we expect of Clubs

We expect open Communication between your Committee and the Student Opportunities / Media teams to make sure everything is running smoothly.

You should be checking your emails, teams and social channels for communications from us and your members.

What you can expect from us

We will communicate all relevant notices as soon as possible, via email- we will send things to your club email address

We aim to respond to all email queries within 3 working days. During peak times (e.g. Freshers), this could take up to 5 working days.

The team do not work weekends, queries sent after 4:30pm on a Friday will not be picked up until the following week.

2. Processes

What we expect of Clubs

We expect you to engage with your required processes, including telling us when things aren't working!

What you can expect from us

We consistently review our processes to ensure they are fit for purpose and put the minimum amount of admin burden on you.

We support you to adhere to these processes.

3. Training

What we expect of Clubs

We expect you to engage with provided training, this includes continued training opportunities through the Student Leader Collective.

What you can expect from us

We facilitate all required training, absorbing incurred costs where necessary.

We also ensure there is suitable accessibility adjustments in place for you as needed.



4. Ambition and Respect

What we expect of Clubs

We want students to enjoy their time at BU, particularly during your time in Committee.

That said, we are not your personal assistants, and our relationship is a working one. You need to respect the staff team accordingly.

You are accountable to your members.
