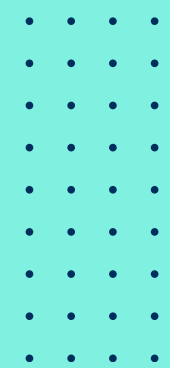

How can I demonstrate my experience?



Education

- Demonstrating time management skills- you have balanced running a society/ being part of a society with your degree
- Successful campaigns/ events
- Any awards you have received from the University/ Student's Union

Volunteering and Qualifications

- Log your committee hours on the Volunteering Hub- e.g. I have volunteered for 3 years, accruing 350 hours across my time in Climbing Club
- Additional courses or qualifications:
 - First Aid/ Mental Health First Aid
 - Student Leader Collective! - Conflict Resolution, Team Management and Employability skills

STAR System

Making a point to talk about your skills is great, but interviewers also need to know there are real situations and experience behind them.

Situation

Explain to them what the situation you faced was. Maybe organising a series of talks, a large event, or needing to take over duties unexpectedly due to someone falling ill.

Task

What were the tasks you had to complete in order to succeed? Don't under estimate them! Give specific goals, e.g. had to engage X amount of people or run Y out of Z events.

Action

Break down what you did! Think about all steps. Don't say "promo on insta", say content design and creation, use of specialist tools e.g. Canva, SM channel management.

Results

Think about the goals from Task. Show your success in no uncertain terms - %s and stats. E.g. "the event exceeded goal attendance by 15%, and 8 people left positive feedback".

Interviews



Do

Research the company, it's values, and the person spec ahead of time. How do you and your skills/experience align with what they are looking for?

Do

Give yourself time to think and feel able to ask for clarification if unsure. If there is something you're unsure of, demonstrate your ability to learn and adaptability.

Don't

Use the same example for multiple questions - show the breadth of your experience.

Don't

Leave without having asked questions. While you're the one being interviewed, this is your chance to get a vibe of what the company is like. Plus they want someone proactive!

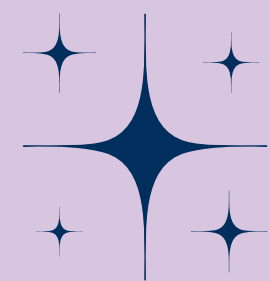

Log your hours

By logging your hours on the SUBU Volunteering Hub, you have a record of all the hard work you have put in to being a committee member!

Volunteering Certificates

Once you have logged your hours, you can receive certificates that could be shared on LinkedIn :
10 Hours for Bronze, 20 Hours for Silver, 30 Hours for Gold and 100 Hours for Platinum

Benefits of Volunteering

- Skills from the role e.g. sector-specific skills
- Shows proactivity
- Could be work-experience when you have a career gap on your CV

Running a society with a high Star Grading shows your skill, dedication, and commitment to your members. Shows you aim to achieve the highest standard of work!

SUBU Awards

Winning a SUBU award either for your society or yourself is a huge achievement that you ought to shout about! You have been endorsed by your SU and by extension the University!

Society Awards

Some Socs opt to hold internal awards every year. If your society is more niche these may highlight specific skill sets or dedication that a broad one, such as the SUBU Awards, couldn't offer.

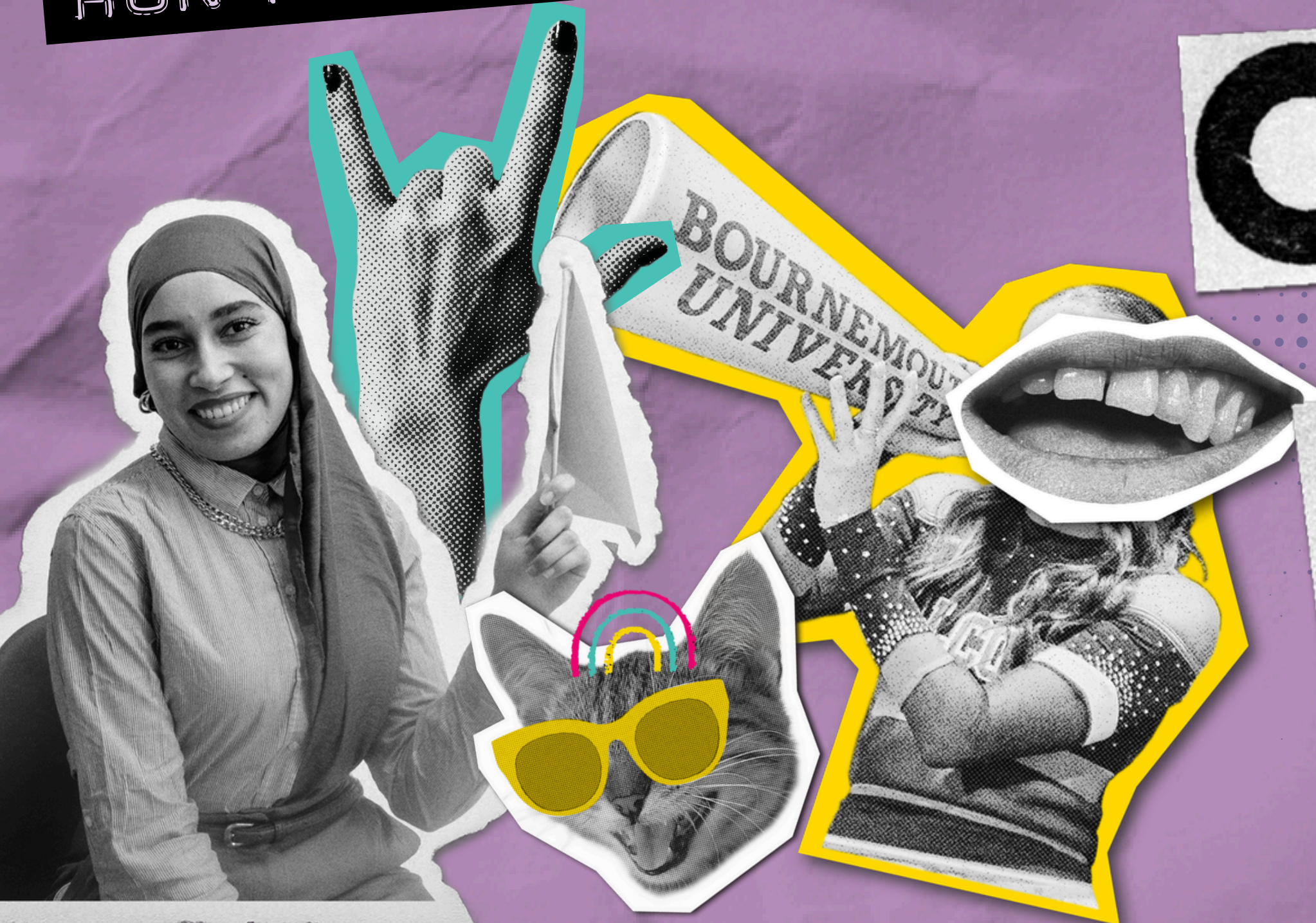
Endorsement
