Criteria	Rating <i>1 – strongly disagree; 3 – neutral; 5 – strongly agree</i>	Notes
All items/flyers being handed out are easily recycled and composted	1 - 2 - 3 - 4 - 5	
Staff are handing flyers only to those students who express genuine interest (e.g. Not just handing something to every passerby)	1 - 2 - 3 - 4 - 5
